# Bowes Creek Country Club

## Stake-by-Stake Description

The beautiful Rick Jacobson-designed golf course at Bowes Creek Country Club incorporates a design that is both challenging and fun. Enhanced by the natural beauty of the land, this exceptional 18-hole course will appeal to casual golfers and accomplished players alike.

**Hole 15 • Par 4, 430 yards**

A downhill tee shot emerges from a chute of mature trees on this strong par 4. The tee shot landing area is framed by a bunker short/right and a series of three bunkers in the hillside on the left. A tee shot that settles close to the fairway bunkers on the left will result in a preferred angle of approach to the green. Bunkers located on the front/right and back/left define multiple strategic pin placement opportunities. The approach is sloped to feed iron shots onto the green while errant shots to the right will test shot-making abilities from tight lies in the fairway chipping area. This stunning par 4 may require a diversity of shots to conquer.

**Hole 14 • Par 3, 170 yards**

The shortest of the par 3's will require precision off the tee. A diverse array of hazards will collect an errant tee shot and may result in an undesirable bogey. Two cavernous bunkers protect the front/left and back/left portions of the green. A deep fairway chipping area falls off the left side of the green, and shots through the green will be collected in a fairway chipping area off the back. The undulating green is the smallest of the par 3's and slopes from right to left. Do not get greedy on this beautiful tree-framed golf hole, and you will set the stage for the finishing holes with par or birdie.

**Hole 13 • Par 4, 380 yards**

This 380-yard journey begins with a spectacular elevated tee shot framed by oak trees. The tee shot landing area is wide, but an exacting placement that avoids the gaping bunker short/right and two bunkers to the left is required to set up the approach shot. An approach bunker on the right and greenside bunker on the front/left frame a green that is surrounded by a low fairway chipping area which will require delicate recovery shots. The green is on a right to left axis with contouring that defines tucked pin placement locations. Proper course management may yield birdie opportunities on this challenging hole.

**Hole 12 • Par 4, 333 yards**

A temptation to go for the green will evolve as the golfer steps up on the tee of the shortest par 4 on the golf course. Alternate tees will provide a variety of angles that the tee shot will be played over the marsh on the foreground. Two fairway bunkers on the left and two cavernous bunkers in the right approach define the golfers' tee shot options. The green is nestled among specimen oak trees, and the elevated approach area will feed tee shots toward the green. A bunker protects the back/left portion of the green, and a fairway chipping area awaits shots that travel through the green. The 12th hole is a true risk/reward hole that fits seamlessly into the environment and brings excitement to the golfer.

**Hole 16 • Par 3, 205 yards**

The demanding 16th hole requires a combination of strength and accuracy. A pristine marsh borders the right side of the golf hole, and trees frame the left side; two bunkers abut the left side of the green and one lies off the back. A low fairway chipping area will collect shots to the right of the green. The green is divided into three distinct pin placement zones that put a premium on tee shot placement. An upper terrace on the left requires a high soft shot over the bunkers while the center portion of the green is receptive to run-up shots. A sliver of green to the right will require accuracy and possibly one extra club to find the putting surface. The final par 3 is a gorgeous hole that exposes the golfer's long iron abilities.

**Hole 17 • Par 4, 366 yards**

This secluded gem is 366 yards of variety. The elevated tee shot will carry the creek and must navigate around the lake on the left. Five bunkers in the tee shot landing area define a "safe" route to the right and a more adventurous route to the left that requires courage and finesse. An approach shot from the left side of the fairway will have access to pin placements tucked beyond two bunkers guarding the right side of the green and a soft approach leading up to front pin placements. A large serpentine bunker frames the approach and extends along the left side of the green to collect errant shots. The green is benched into a hillside and undulations will challenge attempts at birdie. A scenic golf hole that will be fun to play.

**Hole 11 • Par 4, 400 yards**

This stunning par 4 commences with a tee shot over the stream to a tree-lined fairway. The tee shot landing area is framed by a grass hollow on the right and a "directional" bunker on the left that is only reachable for the longest hitters. An approach shot into the prevailing wind will require proper club selection to yield a putt for birdie. The green has two bunkers on the left and a generous fairway chipping area to the right that is visually obscured from an approach bunker on the right. Enjoy the serenity of this green site and beautiful views of the marsh on the horizon.

**Hole 18 • Par 4, 443 yards**

The magnificent 18th hole begins from tees perched high on a ridge providing a panoramic vista of four golf holes and the clubhouse. Don't let the views distract you because a challenge awaits. A lake to the right of the tee shot landing area is buffered by two large bunkers. Two additional bunkers on the left and one in the center of the fairway create multiple tee shot target areas. A downhill tee shot with the prevailing wind provides a risk/reward opportunity to cut the corner of the dogleg to shorten the residual approach shot to the green and avoid the sloped portion of the fairway. Three approach bunkers on the right set up a wide fairway approach from the right into a green angled from right to left. Two greenside bunkers on the left will demand accuracy in approach shots. This is the largest green on the par 4's, and although it will be receptive to long iron approach shots, it will also demand nerves of steel to sink a putt for birdie. This enjoyable golf hole brings a fitting end to a memorable golf experience at Bowes Creek Country Club.

**Hole 10 • Par 5, 516 yards**

At 516 yards, hole 10 is the shortest par 5 at Bowes Creek Country Club. However, do not be lulled into a false sense of security. A wide, two-tiered fairway is visible from the elevated tees yet requires a well placed tee shot between bunkers guarding the landing area. The golfer is then faced with a decision whether to go for the green over the left approach bunker or lay the ball up to the right. A large, elongated green is aligned for receptiveness of second shots to the putting surface. Narrow pin placement locations over two bunkers to the elevated green awaits golfers who choose to play the safe lay-up approach shot. This unique start to the inward nine will likely produce many birdie opportunities.

**Hole 1 • Par 4, 390 yards**

The opening hole sets the stage for a dramatic golf experience at Bowes Creek Country Club. The downhill tee shot targets a generous fairway landing area. However, proper tee shot placement in close proximity to the two bunkers guarding the right will provide a much more desirable angle of approach to the green. The green is aligned on a right to left axis with an open approach from the front/right while the left side contains a low fairway chipping area and bunker. This is a fair but challenging start to an exciting round of golf.

**Hole 9 • Par 4, 380 yards**

The closing hole for the outward nine is a shot maker's golf hole. A lake and natural area border the right side of the golf hole, and a series of four bunkers define alternative tee shot landing zones. The two-tiered fairway will entice golfers to execute a precise tee shot to the narrow part of the fairway adjacent to the lake which will be rewarded with a short iron approach shot. The green is elevated and flanked on the front/right and back/left by bunkers which put a premium on accuracy. Take enough club, or the "false front" on the green will suck your ball back onto the approach area of this beautiful par 4.

**Hole 8 • Par 5, 585 yards**

This brute of 585 yards allows golfers to "grip it and rip it" off the tee. A generous tee shot landing area sets the stage for a strategic second shot. Do not bail out too far to the right, or you may find yourself in a bunker with a partially obscured view of the green. The smallest par 5 green will be an admirable target for lofted iron approach shots and may yield a one putt for birdie if golfers are fortunate enough to get there in three shots.

**Hole 7 • Par 4, 450 yards**

The longest par 4 on the golf course may emerge as one of the toughest holes on the golf course. This scenic hole is framed on the right by a lake and on the left by mature trees. For the best angle of approach to the green, start your tee shot at the bunkers on the left, and fade it to the right to catch the down-slope over the bunker on the right. The long narrow green has a "collection" bunker adjacent to the lake on the right and two "framing" bunkers to the back/left. Generous fairway chipping areas along the entire left side of the green and back/right provide for some margin of error on approach shots to this challenging green. A par will feel like a birdie!

**Hole 6 • Par 5, 540 yards**

This spectacular par 5 features diversity from tee to green. A large lake protects the right side of the tee shot landing area with a lone bunker on the left defining a narrower landing zone for low handicappers. A stream bisects the second landing area, resulting in a risk/reward option for golfers. A conservative shot will be played to the left of the stream, while an aggressive second shot will carry the stream leaving an open approach to the green. A bunker complex transitions to the front/right corner on the green while the stream and a singular bunker guard the left side. The irregular shape to the green provides many tucked pin placement opportunities which will define the preferred angle of approach. This strategic hole will test golfers' mental toughness.

**Hole 2 • Par 4, 433 yards**

The second hole plays over the creek to a very wide fairway that is unique in that it is shared with 6 fairway. A strategic bunker in the left/center of the fairway and two more on the left guard the tee shot landing area. The approach shot is framed by bunkers short left and right and requires an exacting long iron shot into the prevailing wind. A receptive green provides fair putting opportunities.

**Hole 3 • Par 3, 195 yards**

The tees are perched on a ridge and provide a panoramic view of this scenic par 3. The largest green on the golf course abuts a lake on the left. Undulations in the green define strategic pin placements that require finesse in tee shots. An accurate mid-iron shot may result in an opportunity for birdie, but an errant shot will be penalized.

**Hole 4 • Par 4, 380 yards**

This stunning par 4 wraps around a lake on the left which must be avoided with the tee shot. A cavernous bunker complex frames an elevated fairway approach to the green, and a bunker is tucked adjacent to the left side of the putting surface. An approach shot through the green will come to rest in a low fairway chipping area that requires a delicate touch to save par. This fun golf hole could yield birdies.

**Hole 5 • Par 3, 226 yards**

The longest par 3 on the golf course plays slightly uphill and with the prevailing wind. The left side of the hole is bordered by a pristine natural area, and the green site is benched in a hillside. Two bunkers will catch shots to the left of the green while fairway collection areas border the back/left and right sides of the green. A false front on the green provides golfers with a glimpse of the putting surface while the back portion is sloped to hold tee shots. Par will be a good score on this demanding hole.
